#### 7. Our Problem:

We know that most people in need of help obtaining a meaningful job, housing, transportation, food, clothing, medical care, etc. usually don't have the tools necessary to find that help. We also know there are multiple service providers out there that have the ability to help people but they don't know where all of those people are. There are many helpful web sites and other informational sources readily available to offer help, but where are they? <u>Someone needs to tie all this information together into a central information data base, that everyone can have access to, from a single source, that is easy to use.</u>

#### 8. Our Solution:

Utilizing today's best information retrieval technology - "the internet", HRH is providing a web site for those who work with the homeless and those either in or out of the prison system with an information data base they can use as a "Community Bulletin Board" that lists both "Faith Based" and "Community Based" service providers/organizations, and businesses that offer various goods and services to those in need. This is a FREE resource tool intended to Help our Helpers and those persons reaching out for a better way of life for themselves and their families.

#### **13. Our Current Funding:**

As of to date everything has been self funded by Don Hawkins, Founder & Executive Director. HRH is currently housed in shared office space with Other Peoples Properties, LLC with offices at 3936 Pendleton Way in Indianapolis. It is a 2,500 square foot warehouse; with 1,800 being office space and 700 being warehouse space.

Based on the warm reception and positive response that we have received just from HRH's web site and Weekly Newsletter, we would like to expand the area (territory) we cover and the functionality of the data base, as well as add the services to find housing and jobs for our Service Providers. Adding these services will require additional and/or outside funding.

It is estimated that the Phase II web site design costs will be approximately \$12,000, and Phase III (confidential section) approximately \$8,000.

#### 14. Amount of Monies Requested from Grants:

HRH plans to be in operation 12 months a year with an estimated annual budget of \$200,000. We plan to grow at the same rate that the funding becomes available.

#### **15. Additional Funding:**

We are in the process of seeking additional funding thru some small grants and donations and Sponsors for our Information Directory. We are also seeking gifts from foundations and additional larger grants.

Born in Indianapolis, Indiana. Graduated from Harry E. Wood High School in Indianapolis. For three summers, worked as a Page in the United States Senate for Lyndon B. Johnson and Senator Vance Hartke in Washington D.C.

For three years I worked in the offices of Senator Birch Bayh in Washington D.C. For one and a half years, attended Ben Franklin University in Washington D.C. Served in the United States Marine Corps for three years. Served in Vietnam for 21 months.

Employed with Eli Lilly & Company for three years. Self employed under own name for 20 years as a business, marketing and telemarketing consultant helping various individuals and companies in Indiana get started.

In 1984, formed Hawkins International Systems & Services Corp. to build and market a computerized information directory that was installed in various supermarkets in Indiana and New York.

In 1984, started importing tanning, health and fitness equipment from Europe. Because of a chain of events: the market becoming saturated, one of our suppliers filing bankruptcy, I was left with a telemarketing operation, selling only tanning equipment, parts and supplies from New York City to health clubs, tanning salons and beauty shops across the country.

In 1990, that telemarketing room expanded into a marketing and telemarketing operation for telecommunications services. At its peak, we had over 40 people calling on businesses that generated leads for several of our clients, including: moving companies, mortgage companies, real estate companies, attorneys, credit card verification equipment, local and long distance telecommunications services in New York City and the Tri-State area.

In the fall of 1992, I was first introduced to the "Plasma Waste Destruction" concept. In researching the project, I was introduced to several businesses and individuals that have spent several years and several hundreds of thousands of dollars researching plasma energy technology for waste destruction. I found that each group was heading in different directions, but still, wanting to accomplish the same goals.

I realized a project of this magnitude was going to require a tremendous team effort, from different parts of the country, if this project was going to get past the research and development stages, and put in use in the waste management industry. I was unsuccessful in finding a location to build the first facility in several states on the East Coast and Texas.

In the summer of 1995, I returned to Indianapolis. In December 1995 I formed Hawkins Industries, Inc. and introduced this technology to Indianapolis. I have spent the last five years searching for all the right businesses and the right individuals that could be brought together, to build a new and unique business opportunity that would enable these businesses and individuals to put their talents and knowledge together to actually build the first commercial facility for the destruction of man's waste products using plasma energy technology. Information on this technology can be viewed at <u>www.hicompanies.com</u>. Late in 1998 we obtained unanimous approval from the Pike Township Homeowners Association and all the necessary permits from the City of Indianapolis (air) and the State of Indiana (solid waste), including the rezoning of the property. Unfortunately we could never secure the required \$17 million necessary to build the facility. The project has been put on an indefinite hold.

#### **17. Executive Summary:**

Since introducing HRH's Web Site, we have had several people in our industry ask us who we are, and why are we offering this web site. To make a long story short, my name is Don Hawkins and I own a business called Other Peoples Properties, LLC of which we offer another web site that helps investors buy and sell their investment properties. I also formed Other Peoples Construction, Inc. of which I am a General Contractor that works on low-end investment properties. I was a member of The H.O.P.E. Team for several years which I left on the 8th of March of this year.

For the last two plus years, I have been part of a Bible study group Hands of Hope Ministries, Inc. at the Plainfield Correctional Facility (PCF), and I have been one of Judy Helms' mentors since just after the Plainfield ReEntry Educational Facility (PREF) opened. After Ms. Boyd asked me to sit in for her at one of the Plainfield Community Advisory Board Meetings, Superintendent Mike Lloyd (then Acting Superintendent) asked me to serve on the Community Advisory Board as an individual, I accepted. Since then, Superintendent Brett Mize of the Pendleton Correctional Facility has asked me to serve on their Community Advisory Board and help them expand their volunteer program which I am looking forward to helping out. And last month Khadijah Muhammad, the new Director of ReEntry, asked me to serve on Mayor Ballard's new Task Force for ReEntry, of which I am looking forward to working with her and Olgen Williams, the new Deputy Mayor. Why we are offering our web site is outlined on the front of our web site and in our brochures (Our Problem - Our Solution - Our Purpose & Goals).

#### **Plan of Attack:**

**Phase I - is completed -** It consisted of researching the industry and finding out if an All-in-One web site was actually needed in our industry. The answer is a resounding yes! There are a few web sites out there that list a small number of organizations for their own purposes, and there are several organizations that also have their own list of preferred providers, suppliers, etc. but <u>they don't share that information</u>. There is a 2-1-1 program called Connect 2 Help that is put together by the Indiana Public Library but it caters to all of the human and social services industry. It is much too big, too cumbersome, and not user friendly enough for most people to take advantage of, and the way they compile and display their data is not geared to our industry. The bottom line is that no one has catered to just the homeless and those in and out of the prison industry until we put together HRH's web site. And judging from the initial response that I have been getting, the sooner we finish it, the better. It is being greatly appreciated and we are just getting started.

**Phase II** – will consist of us finishing the web site that will include building the data base of almost 1,000 service providers in and around the Indianapolis and METRO area that service Central Indiana. This data base will allow the members of the general public, case workers, specialists, probation and parole officers, pastors, etc. to search for goods and services for those in need. When completed, HRH's web site will be the most complete, easy to use, up to date data base available anywhere.

When Phase II has been completed, HRH's Web Site will be able to be linked from the Mayor's web site, and the Indiana Department of Correction web site. Several service providers have also asked if they could add a link from our web site to their web site. I am having everyone hold off on the links until Phase II is completed. Phase II will also consist of

HRH calling on all service providers that will be listed on our web site and verifying all of their information. It is anticipated that Phase II will be completed within 60 days of funding.

When Phase II has been completed, we will complete "HRH's Information Directory" that will be distributed, free of charge, to everyone coming out of Indiana's prison system, and our city and county jail system. This directory will consist of limited information that is in our web site data base directing them to goods and services they will need to start getting back on their feet.

**Phase III** – will consist of us adding a confidential section to the web site allowing only case workers, specialists, probation and parole officers, service providers, etc. to access the additional information that is not accessible to the general public that we have compiled on jobs and housing for those in need. It will be login & password protected. Phase III will also consist of HRH calling on all churches and business organizations to expand our data base to build a bigger volunteer and contact information base for our Weekly Newsletter. It is anticipated that Phase III will be completed within 60 days from the time that Phase II is completed.

When Phase III has been completed, we will start setting up affiliate offices (at no overhead cost to HRH) utilizing existing neighborhood community centers that will be used to direct the homeless and those getting out of the prison system on "<u>A What to Do, Who to Call, When You Need Help - Training Center</u> - thru neighborhood Community Centers, Service Providers, and Prisons. HRH will provide 'On site & Away" training for those organizations who want to learn more about HRH's information and referral services for those in need and just out of prison.

**Phase IV** – will consist of us calling on potential businesses & business persons that can offer our service providers housing and jobs for their Homeless and ReEntry clients. We want to keep at least three people on the phone all year round securing jobs and housing for those in need.

**Phase V** – will consist of us marketing HRH's services to other communities around the country as outlined above. We believe that there should be this type of combined web site and services available to all communities (metro areas) of 200,000 or more people.
